A BILL

For an ordinance to close Special Assessment Funds and authorizing cash transfers to the General Fund and the Special Assessment Fund Series.

WHEREAS, the Capital Planning and Programming Division (CPP) in the Department of Finance has identified five Special Assessment Funds that were created to support Local Maintenance Districts (LMDs) that are no longer active or have been subsumed by other LMDs or by Business Improvement Districts; and

WHEREAS, two Special Assessment Funds have cash balances, including the Tennyson Street Pedestrian Mall Fund (Accounting No. 46060), which is being dissolved through companion bill request CB20-1284, and the Morrison Road Pedestrian Mall Fund (Accounting No. 46067), which supported an LMD that was terminated by Ordinance No. 812, Series of 2004, and whose remaining funds were to be paid to the Consolidated Morrison Road LMD (Accounting No. 46090); and

WHEREAS, the CPP wishes to transfer the cash balance of the Tennyson Street Pedestrian Mall Fund (Accounting No. 46060) to the General Fund and to transfer the cash balance of the Morrison Road Pedestrian Mall Fund (Accounting No. 46067) to the Special Assessment Fund that supports the Consolidated Morrison Road LMD (Accounting No. 46090); and

WHEREAS, the CPP wishes to close three other Special Assessment Funds that are inactive and do not have cash balances;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. There is hereby authorized the transfer of cash within the Special Assessment Fund Series and to the General Fund in the amounts indicated in the following tabulation:
