Executive Summary:

St. Francis Center has administered Rapid Resolution programming, also commonly called Diversion, since 2018. Rapid Resolution is a service model on the spectrum of support that attempts to prevent people from entering homelessness through timely financial assistance, mediation with family, friends, and/or landlords, and other problem-solving assistance.

As of August 2020, St. Francis Center had already served the goal count of clients (225) with diversion services, leveraging nearly all of the budgeted client services funds. Additionally, St. Francis Center has nearly met the retention goal (75%) at 74% retention rate through Q2, including 90-95% in Q2. This contract amendment extends service goals and client service funds to continue operations through the remainder of 2020. Amendment funding would allow for an additional 49 clients to be provided with diversion services.

This proposed increase in contract funding was not pre-planned. As of August 2020, St. Francis Center had already served the yearly goal count of clients (225) with diversion services, leveraging nearly all of the budgeted client services funds. While the budget was drawn largely on an expected level pace for the first half of the year, St. Francis Center saw an increased demand among clients falling behind on rent payments in July, for which assistance is much more expensive than with most Rapid Resolution tactics. This additional funding allows contracted services to continue with the ability to meet low-cost client needs (excluding most rental assistance) in line with the Rapid Resolution model. Contractor is now more aware of other programs that would be better resourced to meet rental assistance needs.
