For an ordinance renaming Columbus Park located at 1501 West 38 th Avenue as "La Raza Park"			
WHEREAS, the City and County of Denver owns and operates Columbus Park, located 1501			
West 38 th Avenue, as a designated park under the Denver Charter; and			
WHEREAS, the area in which this park is located, Northwest Denver has a strong Chicano			
and Latino population and was the epicenter of the Chicano Movement in the 1960s and the 1970s;			
and			
WHEREAS, to this day there are many celebrations in the park that honor the culture and			
victories that this movement created, including Dia de los Muertos, immigrant rights events, cultural			
events and social justice marches; and			
WHEREAS, supporters of renaming do not consider the renaming as "rewriting history", bu			
rather celebrating the specific history and culture of the neighborhood within which the park is			
located; and			
WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedure established by the Department of Parks and			
Recreation's Naming Policy, a petition was initiated by Councilwoman Amanda Sandoval and signed			
by 701 individuals to rename Columbus Park as "La Raza Park," with forty-five (45) letters or emails			
of support from Colorado Senator Julie Gonzales; Colorado poet laureate Bobby LeFebre; and			
Leadership Council Spokesperson for the American Indian Movement of Colorado Glenn Morris; and			
WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation supports the			
proposed renaming of this park and the Denver Parks and Recreation Advisory Board voted at its			
meeting on November 16, 2020, to recommend the renaming of Columbus Park to ""La Raza Park.'			
BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:			
Section 1. That Columbus Park be and the same is hereby renamed, and shall be known			
as La Raza Park.			
Section 2 . That this action shall be effective upon the final adoption of the ordinance.
