

Problem



Predictability

• Public has little idea of when a hearing may start – problematic for childcare, requesting time away from work, etc.

Staff Resources

Administration staff must spend time outside their normal work hours to attend Council

Efficiency

Council meetings running in to late hours of the night may not receive sharpest debate


Accessibility

• 5:30 Start time creates inequitable access to Council for those who do not have traditional 9 to 5 jobs

Workload

• There has been a significant increase in bills / contracts coming to Council

Meeting format stagnant for > 50 years



Changes in Denver

- Population has increased by over 200k (estimate)¹
- Workforce more two-income households²
- Advent of Additional Viewing Options –
 Denver8 and Streaming
- Accessibility Zoom, email, virtual town halls, etc.

Split-meeting Proposal



- Routine City Business meeting (1:00 PM)
 - Allows city staff and subject-matter experts to perform duties within the normal work week
 - Allows for additional time for Proclamations
- Required and Courtesy Public Hearings (4/5/6:00 PM)
 - Provides the public with a predictable start time
- 30' General Public Comment (Prior to or Upon Adjournment)
 - Allows president to extend comment without interfering in city business
 - Allows for comment on any pending item
