On my paternal side of the family I share close lineage to Chief Black Hawk (also the namesake of the CO gambling town) & Olympic Medalist Jim Thorpe. Our original Sauk family name was "Where the Whirlpool Gathers" — since this is a word with 16 characters, early Colonizers decided Allen was easier to pronounce.

I am hopeful in the future of my people and strive to serve the Native American Community through the endeavors of the American Indian Commission.
