In 2020, HOST issued first shared procurement for programs/services spanning housing continuum

Why issue shared procurement?

- Opportunity for alignment in programming and investments
- Consolidate contracts with similar purposes and resources, reducing number of contracts HOST and its partners need to process and manage
- Support multi-year contracts where possible

NOFA Contracts Overview

- Total of 64 NOFA contracts awarded
- 29 contracts exceed \$500,000, requiring City Council approval
- 25 contracts have come through committee
- 1 contract to present today
- Total of 3 remaining contract resolutions to be submitted to City Council in the coming weeks
- Additional contracts may be awarded at a future time (depending on resources)

Scope of Work

This project will fund shelter operations and programing for men experiencing homelessness at the 48th Avenue shelters located at 4330 and 4600 48th Ave.; day shelter for people experiencing homelessness at the Lawrence Street Community Center, 2222 Lawrence St.; and case management support at multiple Denver Rescue Mission sites. This contract will serve 14,300 individuals.

Background

This is a new contract expanded with 2B to 24-hour services at the 48th shelter. This contract includes operations at the existing 48th shelter (4330 E 48th) through June then switching operations to the new 48th shelter (4600 E 48th) to serve men from July through the end of the year.
