What is Restorative Justice?

Response to crime that focuses on addressing & repairing harm

Emphasizes:

- Making things right for victim
- Defendant taking responsibility
- Reintegrating D back into community with skills & awareness to prevent future crime
- Opportunity for victim & community to have a significant voice in the justice process

Many models of restorative justice



Why RJ? What Can it Offer the Criminal Justice System?

- Provides Victims with a Voice
- Greater Victim Satisfaction
- Increases Defendants' Awareness & Empathy
- Reduces Recidivism
- Increases Public Safety
- Empowers & Engages Communities
- Cost Savings



Case Eligibility:

Victim is open to resolving case through Restorative Denver

Defendant is willing to take accountability & repair the harm

Initially, misdemeanor cases, non-DV





Anyone can identify a potential case DA / VA / Defense Counsel

DA has gatekeeping power



Restorative Denver is Victim-Centered

- Victim must be open to RJ
- Victim contact
- Options for participation
- Learning
 - Victims are more eager to participate in cases of greater harm



Contract Examples:

- Community service aimed at specifically repairing the harm caused
- Restitution
- Apology letter
- Anger management, parenting, conflict resolution classes
- Attend AA meetings or counseling sessions
- Read "Real Queer America: LGBTQ Stories from Red States" to discuss at the celebration circle



Post-Conference:

Monitor compliance

Notice of completion

Case dismissed & sealed if successful

3-6 months from referral to completion



Quotes from Restorative Denver Participants:

- "I feel that I have brought some peace of mind to the person I harmed & his family. I feel that this process is also bringing closure to my family. The facilitators acted with compassion & fairness, & guided everyone in a non-judgmental way through the process."
- "I am excited to be a part of this program & to see the outcome. Participating in this program has changed the way I feel about myself."
- "What has changed for me is that I actually have really enjoyed completing the items on my contract & that has benefitted my general outlook on certain topics."

- 65: Successfully Completed
- 28: Currently in Program
- 6: D Withdrew Before Starting
- 1: Unsuccessful



COST & CAPACITY:

COST: \$1000 per case from referral to dismissal



30% cheaper than traditional prosecution with even greater savings over time!

Future of Restorative Denver:

Looking for multi-year funding to expand the program
 Expand capacity to at least 10 cases per month
 Officially open to felonies
