Mr. Amador has a passion for education. He worked with Denver Public Schools in the Facility Modernization program within Facility Management helping deliver the 2008 & 2012 General Obligation Bonds totaling \$454M & \$469M respectively. As the Senior Project Manager for Stapleton Northfield High School at Paul Sandoval Campus — Denver Public Schools' first new high school in more than 20 years - Andrew helped lead the development of the 40 acre site, with an inclusive community engagement process to strike the right balance between resident desires, district needs and budgetary constraints of the bond-funded project. The result is a state-of-the-art facility that addresses the future needs of the Stapleton community.

Currently Mr. Amador is currently working at the University of Denver to fulfill the Denver Advantage program in which he is the Senior Project Manager and worked on \$72.5M Community Commons, which includes classrooms, study spaces, as well as places for programming, collaboration activities & central dining for the campus. He also worked on a \$55.5M first-year/first-time dormitory for an innovative & quality experience for freshman students. Both projects were completed in the fall of 2020. As a former councilman for the City of Commerce City, Andrew set the policy direction for Colorado's fourth-fastest growing municipality.
