15	adopt and maintain a policy that strictly prohibits themselves and their appointees from engaging in		
16	any behavior constituting discrimination, harassment, and/or retaliation in the scope of employment.		
17	The policy must set forth processes for:		
18	(a) Reporting complaints against elected officials and appointees to an appropriate third-party;		
19	(b) Prompt, thorough and impartial investigation of credible complaints;		
20	(c) Ensuring confidentiality in the process to the extent permissible;		
21	(d) Prohibiting retaliation for making complaints, and/or attesting, assisting or participating in the		
22	process; and,		
23	(e) <u>Resolution of alleged violations.</u>
