## 2021 Downtown Denver Business Improvement District Renewal

Connecting People, Place & Business for the Benefit of Downtown Denver



#### Legislative Summary

An ordinance to approve petitions requesting continuance of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District for a 10-year period.

- The District's initial Operating Plan requires the District to file petitions and seek Council approval of the petitions and approve the District's continuation every 10-years.
- The petition threshold for continuation is 50% of the District's assessed value and 50% of the District's acreage.
- The District has held a board meeting ratifying the petitions and the request to renew the District for another 10-year period.




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## **Downtown Denver BID:**




## About the Downtown **Denver BID**

The DDBID also partners with key organizations from both the public and private sectors to support downtown businesses and properties.







- Economic Development








We play an integral role in creating a powerful economic engine for the city, state and region by supporting businesses.
