Support/Opposition. There has been strong support for this change. The HFDK Initiative has received feedback from current/potential grantees, the HFDK Commission, community stakeholders and City Council. The HFDK Commission members and staff developed.

grantees, the HFDK Commission, community stakeholders and City Council. The HFDK Commission members and staff developed the proposed language changes and voted to approve in December 2020. Support from City Council was shown during the annual reporting presentation in December 2020, in one on one briefings, and by the two City Councilwomen who are represented on the HFDK Commission (Councilwoman Ortega and Councilwoman Torres). DDPHE has not received any opposition to the proposed ballot language changes.

The specific modifications include:

• Striking the requirement that Commissioners "be a resident" of Denver to "live or work" in Denver to be more inclusive

To be completed by Mayor's Legislative Team:

Remove the minimum age requirement of 21 years (to allow youth to serve on the Commission if qualified and interested)

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- Change "under 18" to "18 and under" to include high school students of all ages in grant activities and to be more aligned with standard age cut offs
- Change a "majority of activities" to "qualifying programmatic activities", which would allow more organizations to apply (including those that may have less than 50% of their activities go towards feeding kids or providing food-based education, but who may want to increase this work)
- Clarify that distributed grant funds (rather than organizations overall) need to principally benefit Denver residents
- Strike "primary purpose" to again allow organizations that may feed kids as a smaller portion of their work to still apply
- Clarify that "nublic schools in Denver" can apply (including individual DPS schools and charter schools) in addition to DPS
