6 7 8	For an ordinance amending Section 2-242 and Section 2-243 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code regarding the Denver Food Commission.
9	WHEREAS, Initiated Ordinance No. 302, passed in the election of November 6, 2018,
10	is a citizen initiated ordinance entitled "Denver Food Services for Youth Sales Tax." (Ord. No.
11	302, § 8, 11-6-18).
12	WHEREAS, Section 2-242 and Section 2-243, Division 6 of the Denver Revised
13	Municipal Code is to be amended to conform based on Initiated Ordinance 302 which was
14	citizen initiated and was effectively passed directly by the people
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:
16	Section 1. That sections 2-242 (d) and 2-243 (c), Division 6 of the Denver Revised Municipal
17	Code shall be amended by adding the underlined language, and deleting the stricken language, as
18	follows:
19	Sec. 2-242. – Appointment, qualifications, and terms.
20	(a) The Denver food commission shall consist of the following thirteen (13) commissioners:three
21	(3) persons from the mayor's cabinet, or department heads, who shall be appointed to the
22	commission by the mayor; two (2) members of city council, who shall be approved by city council;
23	four (4) residents of the city, who shall be appointed to the commission by the mayor; and four
24	(4) representatives of city-wide organizations or institutions engaged in food related activities,
25	who shall be appointed to the commission by the mayor.
26	(b) In making appointments, the mayor and city council will give consideration to assure a balance
27	of knowledge and skill including, but not limited to, experience with food, gardening, youth
28	development, non-profit administration, public health, grant-making, andbusiness development.
29	(c) The Denver food commission shall reflect the geographic, demographic, socioeconomic,
30	and ethnic diversity and composition of the City and County of Denver.
31	(d) Each commissioner must be a resident of live or work in the City and County of Denver, over
32	the age of twenty-one (21) years, not currently be a volunteer or paid staff person of an
33	organization applying for Healthy Food for Denver's Kids Initiative funding, and willing todisclose
34	any potential conflicts of interest.

- 1 (e) Commissioners will serve without compensation.
- 2 "Sec. 2-243. Powers and duties.

(a) The Denver food commission shall institute and promulgate procedures for the application,
consideration, and determination of distribution of revenues from the Healthy Food for Denver's
Kids Initiative Fund and any other funds raised or allocated to support the Healthy Food for
Denver's Kids Initiative. The procedures shall expressly prohibit any and all discrimination on the
basis of race, color, religion, national origin, gender, age, military status, sexual orientation,
marital status, or physical or mental disability.

- 9 (b) The Denver food commission shall create criteria for the selection of organizations to
 10 receive monies from the Healthy Food for Denver's Kids Initiatives fund.
- 11 (c) At the minimum, criteria shall include the following:
- (i) The requirement that all distributions of revenues shall help Denver's kids, primarily 12 Denver's low income and at-risk youth, through year-round access for up to three (3) 13 healthy meals and healthy snacks per day for Denver's youth under the age of 18 age 14 eighteen (18) and under; hands-on experiential education and public health programs 15 associated with farming, gardening, cooking, home economics, and healthy eating; and 16 preferentially procuring food from Colorado farms, ranches, and food manufacturing 17 businesses so long as they are less than ten (10) percent more expensive than comparable 18 out-of-state foods. 19
- (ii) The requirement that revenues be distributed by the Denver food commission onlyto
 organizations which conduct a majority of their activities <u>qualifying programmatic</u>
 <u>activities</u> within the city and county of Denver, and which <u>so long that distributed</u>
 <u>revenues</u> principally benefit the residents of the city and county of Denver.
- 24 (iii) The requirement that any recipients provide regular reporting on their activities.
- (iv) An allowance for the payment or reimbursement of basic operations and special project
 costs, provision for a diversity of participation, and provision for participation bynew and
 emerging organizations as well as by stable and established organizations.
- 28 (v) An allowance for no more than ten (10) percent of the total revenues raised for andby
- the Healthy Food for Denver's Kids Initiative be used to cover city expenses directly
 related to the administration of this initiative.

The Denver food commission shall only distribute monies from the Healthy Food for Denver's Kids Initiatives fund to recipients who are either non-profit organizations in good standing that have a determination letter in effect from the U.S. Internal Revenue Service confirming the organization

1	meets the requirements of 26 USC 501(c)(3) and whose primary purpose is to that provide
2	healthy meals and healthy snacks for Denver's youth under the age of 18 age eighteen (18) and
3	under; hands-on experiential education and public health programs associated with farming,
4	gardening, cooking, home economics, and healthy eating; or the preferential procurement of food
5	from Colorado farms, ranches, and food manufacturing businesses so long as they are less than
6	ten (10) percent more expensive than comparable out-of-state foods; or agencies of local
7	government, including Denver Public Schools and public schools in Denver, that have programs
8	directly furthering such purposes.
