SERIES OF 2021 COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE: 4 5 6 7 A BILL 8 For an ordinance submitting to a vote of the qualified and registered electors of the city 9 and county of Denver at a special municipal election to be held in conjunction with the 10 coordinated election of November 2, 2021, a proposed amendment to the charter 11 pertaining to the structure of the office of the independent monitor. 12 13 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER: 15 16 **Section 1.** There is hereby submitted to the properly qualified and registered electors of the city and county of Denver for their approval or rejection at a special municipal election to be 17 conducted at the same time and in conjunction with the coordinated election to be held on 18 19 November 2, 2021, a proposed amendment to the charter of the city and county of Denver, as 20 follows: 21 22 Effective upon publication and filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with 23 the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado, the following sections of the 24 Charter of the city and county of Denver are amended to read as follows: 25 Amend §2.6.7 by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined to 26 27 read as follows: 28 § 2.6.7 29 30 <u>ARTICLE XII. - INDEPENDENT MONITOR</u> 31 §12.1.1 Office of Independent Monitor. 32 (A) Office created. 33 (i) There is hereby created the office of the independent monitor ("monitor's office") for 34 the City and County of Denver. This office shall consist of a full-time monitor with appropriate 35 professional and support staff. For purposes of this section, "monitor" means the head of the office

of the independent monitor.

- (ii) The monitor's office shall actively monitor and participate in any investigations as may be prescribed in ordinance of uniformed personnel; make recommendations to the manager of safety regarding administrative action, including possible discipline, for such uniformed personnel; make recommendations regarding policy issues; and address any other issues of concern to the community, the members of the citizen oversight board ("board") created pursuant to subsection (B) of this section, the city council, the manager of safety, the chief of police, or the sheriff. For purposes of this article, "uniformed personnel" means all members of the classified service of the Denver police department, all sworn members of the Denver sheriff department, and members of the Denver fire department who are authorized to carry and use firearms on duty.
- (iii) The monitor shall establish standards of professional conduct and a comprehensive training program for its own staff in order to evaluate whether internal investigations have been property conducted and to make recommendations as to the sustaining of rule violations, the imposition of disciplinary sanctions, and changes in policy and training.
- (iv) The monitor shall exercise such other powers and duties as may be provided by ordinance.
- (v) The monitor may employ or contract for services of an independent general counsel who must be a member of the Colorado Bar. Upon request of the monitor, independent general counsel may serve in lieu of the Department of Law in the following enumerated functions:
- (a) The monitor may retain independent general counsel to provide legal advice under §6.1.3(B) to assist the monitor in the performance of its duties. Legal advice of the independent general counsel does not constitute a formal opinion under 6.1.3(B).
- (b) The monitor may use independent general counsel to serve as special counsel if a dispute arises under §6.1.2.

All amounts paid for services shall be from the appropriation to the monitor.

- (B) The citizen oversight board. There is hereby created the citizen oversight board, the size, qualifications, composition and appointment of which shall be as provided by ordinance. The functions of the board shall be to:
 - (i) Assess the effectiveness of the monitor's office;
- (ii) Make policy-level recommendations regarding discipline, use of force, and other policies; rules; hiring; training; community relations; and the <u>compliaint</u> process;
- (iii) Address any other issues of concern to the community, members of the board, the monitor, the manager of safety, the chief of police, the sheriff, or the fire chief;

1 (iv) Make recommendations as to specific cases as may be prescribed in ordinance: 2 and 3 (v) Exercise such other powers and duties as may be provided by ordinance-; and, In addition to executing the powers and duties assigned to the citizen oversight 4 (vi) board, the citizen oversight board shall appoint, by and with the consent of city council, the monitor 5 or any appointee who will serve as monitor in the interim. The monitor shall serve at the pleasure 6 7 of the citizen oversight board. 8 Amend 6.1.3 by deleting the language stricken to read as follows: § 6.1.3 - Functions of the Department of Law. 9 10 (D) Drafting such legislation and rendering such formal opinions as specified in Section 3.3.5(D) and as may be requested by the Mayor, the City Council, the Auditor or any other officer 11 12 of the City and County, acting in his or her official capacity; 13 14 Amend § 9.1.1 (E)(xiii) by deleting the language stricken and adding the language 15 underlined to read as follows: 16 § 9.1.1 Career Service personnel system. 17 any employee appointed to serve at the pleasure of the mayor for the 18 purpose of monitoring internal investigations and disciplinary actions in the Department of Safety, and any employees appointed by the monitor to serve at the pleasure of the monitor. The 19 appointment of any monitor by the mayor pursuant to this or any other provision of the charter 20 shall require confirmation by the city council. The director of the office of independent monitor 21 22 ("monitor") shall serve at the pleasure of the citizen oversight board and up to two employees 23 appointed by the monitor shall serve at the pleasure of the monitor. Prior to any removal of the 24 monitor by the citizen oversight board, the board shall consult with the city council regarding its 25 intention to remove the monitor. 26 27 **Section 2.** The ballot shall contain the following title and submission clause: 28 29 REFERRED QUESTION 30 Shall the Charter of the City and County of Denver be amended to allow the citizen 31 oversight board to appoint the independent monitor with consent of city council,

providing the office of the monitor with independent legal counsel and establishing

employment status of employees?

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2	Section 3. The proper officials of the City and County of Denver as are charged with duties		
3	relating to the election shall, before the election, issue such calls, make such certifications and		
4	publications, give such notices, make such appointments, and do all such other acts and things		
5	in connection with the submission of this Charter amendment to the registered electors of the City		
6	and County of Denver at the election as are required by the Constitution and laws of the State of		
7	Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.		
8	Section 4. The ballots cast at such election shall be canvassed and the results		
9	ascertained, determined, and certified in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution		
10	and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of		
11	Denver.		
12	Section 5. If any section, paragraph, clau	se, or other portion of this ordinance is h	neld to
13	be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance		
14	shall not be affected.
