(8) WHEREAS, the Denver Clerk and Recorder (the "Clerk") is conducting a coordinated
election pursuant to the Uniform Election Code of 1992, being articles 1 through 13 of title 1, C.R.S.
(the "Uniform Election Code") on November 2, 2021; and

5 (9) **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 8.2.1 of the Charter, Section 15-4 Denver Revised 6 Municipal Code, Section 1-1-102 of the Uniform Election Code, Section 31-10-102.7, C.R.S. of the 7 Municipal Election Code, and this ordinance, the City Council may elect to utilize the provisions of 8 the Uniform Election Code in order to participate in the coordinated election on November 2, 2021; 9 and

10 (10) **WHEREAS**, the City Council hereby determines that it is necessary to submit to the 11 qualified and registered electors of the City, at the coordinated election to be held on November 2, 12 2021, the question of creating an indebtedness in the amounts specified in Section 3 below and the 13 imposition of an ad valorem property tax for the payment of such indebtedness; and

14 (11) WHEREAS, it is necessary to set forth certain procedures concerning the conduct of15 the Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF
 DENVER:

Section 1. All action heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance) by the City and the officers thereof, directed towards the election, and the objects and purposes herein stated is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 2. Unless otherwise defined herein, all terms used herein shall have the
 meanings defined in the Uniform Election Code.

Section 3. Pursuant to Section 8.2.3 of the Charter, the City Council hereby determines to call a special election to be conducted pursuant to the Uniform Election Code as part of the coordinated election being conducted by the Clerk on November 2, 2021. The City Council hereby determines that at the Election, there shall be submitted to the qualified and registered electors of the City the following question:

Denver Parks and Recreation System Bonds

SHALL THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER DEBT BE INCREASED \$54,070,000, WITH A
MAXIMUM REPAYMENT COST OF \$93,118,000, WITH NO EXPECTED INCREASE IN THE
CITY'S CURRENT RATE OF TAXATION FOR GENERAL OBLIGATION DEBT SERVICE BASED
ON THE CITY'S PROJECTED ASSESSED VALUE, THE PROCEEDS THEREOF TO BE USED
FOR REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE DENVER PARKS AND RECREATION SYSTEM,

1 WHICH MAY INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- DEVELOPMENT AND CONSTRUCTION OF TWO NEW PARKS IN NORTHEAST DENVER
 AND SOUTH DENVER, RESPECTIVELY; AND
- IMPROVEMENTS AT PARKS INCLUDING REPLACING PLAYGROUND AND
 RECREATION EQUIPMENT, REPLACING AND RESTORING ATHLETIC FIELDS AND
 COURTS; AND
- CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING RENOVATING AND
 BUILDING RESTROOMS, AND REBUILDING THE SWIMMING POOL AT MESTIZO CURTIS PARK;

10 BY THE ISSUANCE AND PAYMENT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, NOTES, LOAN AGREEMENTS OR OTHER MULTIPLE FISCAL YEAR FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS, WHICH 11 SHALL BE ISSUED OR INCURRED IN SUCH MANNER AND CONTAINING SUCH TERMS 12 13 NOT INCONSISTENT HEREWITH AS THE CITY MAY DETERMINE (THE EXPENDITURE OF 14 THE PROCEEDS THEREOF TO BE PUBLICLY REPORTED BY THE CITY ON AN ANNUAL BASIS); AND SHALL CITY AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES BE INCREASED WITHOUT 15 LIMITATION AS TO RATE BUT BY NOT MORE THAN A MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF 16 \$10,005,000 ANNUALLY IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, 17 IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS OR TO CREATE A RESERVE 18 19 FOR SAME; AND SHALL THE CITY BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUEFINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS TO REFUND OR REFINANCE SUCH FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS AUTHORIZED IN THIS QUESTION. 20 PROVIDED THAT SUCH REFUNDING FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS WHEN COMBINED WITH 21 OTHER OUTSTANDING FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS AUTHORIZED IN THIS QUESTION DO NOT 22 EXCEED THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL LIMITS OR REPAYMENT COSTS AUTHORIZED BY THIS 23 24 QUESTION?

25 **Section 4**. The Clerk is hereby appointed as the designated election official of the City for 26 purposes of performing acts required or permitted by law in connection with the Election.

27 **Section 5.** The officers and employees of the City are hereby authorized and directed to 28 take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 6. If a majority of the votes cast on the question to authorize general obligation indebtedness and the levy of ad valorem property taxes submitted at the Election shall be in favor of incurring general obligation indebtedness and levying ad valorem property taxes as provided in such question, the City, acting through the Mayor and City Council, shall be authorized to proceed with the necessary action to incur general obligation indebtedness and levy ad valorem property taxes in accordance with such question. Any authority to contract general obligation indebtedness or to levy ad valorem property taxes, if conferred by the results of the Election, shall be deemed and considered a continuing authority to contract the general obligation indebtedness and levy the ad valorem taxes so authorized at any one time, or from time to time, and neither the partial exercise of the authority so conferred, nor any lapse of time, shall be considered as exhausting or limiting the full authority so conferred.

Section 7. 8 If a majority of the votes cast on the question authorize the incurrence of general 9 obligation indebtedness and levy of an ad valorem property tax as described in the question set forth in Section 3 above, the City intends to issue or incur such general obligation indebtedness in the 10 11 approximate aggregate principal amount of \$54,070,000 to pay the costs of the certain public 12 improvements described in the election question (the "Project") including the reimbursement of 13 certain costs incurred by the City prior to the execution and delivery of such bonds, upon terms 14 acceptable to the City, as authorized in an ordinance to be hereafter adopted and to take all further 15 action which is necessary or desirable in connection therewith. The officers, employees and agents 16 of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and 17 consummate the transactions contemplated hereby and shall take all action necessary or desirable 18 to finance the Project and to otherwise carry out the transactions contemplated by the ordinance. 19 This ordinance is intended to be a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse expenditures within the 20 meaning of Treasury Regulation § 1.150-2.

Section 8. Pursuant to Article XX of the State Constitution and the Charter, all State statutes that might otherwise apply in connection with the provisions of this ordinance (including, without limitation C.R.S. § 31-11-111) are hereby superseded to the extent of any inconsistencies or conflicts between the provisions of this ordinance and such statutes. Any such inconsistency or conflict is intended by the City Council and shall be deemed made pursuant to the authority of Article XX of the State Constitution and the Charter.

Section 9. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall in no manner affect any remaining provisions of this ordinance.

30 **Section 10**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed 31 to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any ordinance 32 or part of any ordinance heretofore repealed.
