9	9 WHEREAS , the Honorable Cathy Reynolds was elected to an a	at-large seat on the Denver City	
10	Council in May 1975, the first woman to be elected to this body; and

12	WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds was re-elected at-large in 1979, 1983, 1987, 1991, 1995 and 1999,		
13	coming in first each time and ultimately serving the longest tenure of any Denver City Council		
14	member, a public service spanning 28 years and two weeks, and which was ended only by the		
15	5 start of term limits; and

17	7 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds was chosen by her colleagues to I	ead the Council as President a	
18	record four terms and as President Pro-Tempore a record eight terms due to her institutional		
19	acumen, deliberative fairness and legislative "smarts;" and

21	1 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds made an indelible mark as a leader	er on numerous policy advances of	
22	great significance, putting Denver in the forefront of societal cha	ange; and

24	WHEREAS, among these many initiatives was her sponsorship	in 1990 of one of the nation's first	
25	gay rights laws, igniting a conflict that led to a controversial 199	2 statewide initiative seeking to	
26	6 strike down Denver's and similar local laws, followed by a victor	ry at the Colorado Supreme Court	
27	and soon after that, a landmark victory for gay rights in 1996 at	the U.S. Supreme Court; and

29	9 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds led the effort to eliminate a zoning	regulation that prohibited	
30	0 unrelated adults from living together in the city's most exclusive	residential neighborhoods, which	
31	1 regulation had effectively banned unmarried couples from living	together in neighborhoods with	
32	that most restrictive zone district, and particularly gay couples s	since at that time it was not legal for	
33	3 them to marry; and

WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds, in the face of strong initial pushback from colleagues, worked 1 2 tirelessly to establish a dedicated mill levy to provide regular, reliable and sustainable funding for services for people with developmental disabilities, building a coalition after several failed attempts 3 4 eventually to amend the mayor's budget to include this mill levy that still serves the community today; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, in 1989, in the midst of receiving numerous death threats, Cathy Reynolds 8 successfully sponsored a ban on assault-style firearms in Denver, which survived challenges both 9 from the state legislature and in the courts; and 10 11 **WHEREAS**, Cathy Reynolds played instrumental roles in expanding professional sports in Denver 12 as part of the effort to win a Major League Baseball expansion team to the city as the Colorado 13 Rockies and to bring the Quebec Nordigues of the National Hockey League to Denver as the 14 Colorado Avalanche; and 15 WHEREAS, Denver's most significant infrastructure projects of the late 20th century bear the 16 17 fingerprints of Cathy Reynolds as a leader in either the conception, financing or delivery of such 18 projects as the Colorado Convention Center, the convention center hotel (now the Hyatt Regency 19 Hotel), Denver International Airport, the new Denver Broncos stadium, Coors Field and Pepsi 20 Center (now Ball Arena); and 21 22 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds would be the first person to acknowledge and give credit for the roll 23 call of her record of accomplishments to the many other individuals with whom she worked, because she believed in collaboration, teamwork and solutions; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds took time to mentor and work with other members of the City Council, 27 who benefitted from her advice and quidance in their development as city leaders; and 28 29 WHEREAS; her leadership abilities were tapped by numerous other organizations including the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District Board, on which she served for her entire 28 years on 30

the Council and of which she served as chair for the last 23 years of her tenure; and

1 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds was elected two times to serve as president of the Colorado

2 Municipal League, the state's principal platform for the interests of municipal governments across

the state with more than 250 of Colorado's cities and towns as members; and

5 **WHEREAS,** in 1987, Cathy Reynolds was elected president of the National League of Cities,

making her the nation's primary representative of the interests of the nation's cities, during which

time she testified in Congress on matters affecting those interests; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Cathy Reynolds was a leader in many other community, state and national

organizations including Colorado Counties Inc., Denver Regional Council of Governments, Denver

Labor Relations Task Force, Denver Anti-Crime Council, the Justice Center Task Force and the

Denver Center for the Performing Arts; and

14 WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds earned numerous awards for her public service including a Colorado

AIDS Project Leadership Recognition Award, a Friends of the River Award from the Greenway

Foundation and induction into the Colorado Tourism Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Cathy Reynolds continued to contribute to the City and County of Denver after term

limits ended her service on this body in 2003, by serving as a charter member of the Citizen

Oversight Board and the Convention Center Hotel Board; and

WHEREAS, Cathy was born Cathleen Lou Carter on Nov. 28, 1944, in Kansas City, Mo., was

raised in Fairway, Kansas, was graduated from Shawnee Mission North High School, where she

met and dated Rick Reynolds, after which they went to the University of Kansas and then married

on June 5, 1965, and raised two sons, Robert and Matthew; and

WHEREAS, Cathy and Rick Reynolds moved to Denver in 1966 when Rick was hired by Denver

Public Schools, and Cathy soon involved herself in politics, running unsuccessfully for the state

legislature before winning her seat on the City Council; and
