18-0305 Amends a contract with the Mental Health Center of Denver to add 12 months for a new expiration date of 12-31-18 and to add an additional \$850,000 for a new contract total of \$1.7 million to provide housing and treatment services for 75 chronically homeless individuals with co-occurring serious mental illness and substance use disorders, citywide (SOCSV-2016-31657-01).

There is no change to the agreement amount (ENVHL-201523490-02).
